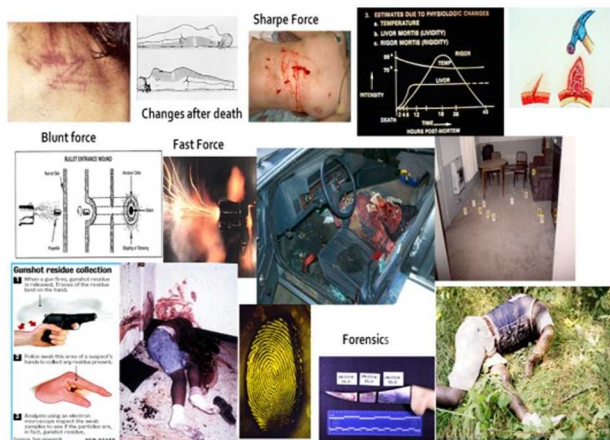

This is not the normal course on *homicide* investigation. It is a course about **death** investigations and includes looking at child deaths, suicides, accidental, and natural, deaths with the intention of eliminating the possibility of a death resulting from a homicide.

Emphasis is placed on how an agency responds to a violent crime can directly impact their clearance rate and the importance of conducting an aggressive preliminary investigation during the first 72 hours. Other topics include aspects of crime scene examinations and forensics from a detective's perspective and an introduction to crime scene staging.

The importance of working together with the prosecutor, the CSI unit, Coroner/Medical Examiner, and other detectives is stressed and using a teamwork approach is crucial to resolution of all death investigations.

Coordinating with other outside agencies including ViCAP, NAMUS, NCIC, military departments, and the BAU are covered.

Case studies are provided as examples of conducting a complete death investigation and examples of investigative failures are also discussed..
