ABOUT THE COURSE

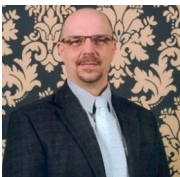
This 40-hour course was designed upon request from the Las Vegas Metropolitan Police Department. Its primary goal is to make the experienced crime scene investigator comfortable and proficient with discussing and presenting Bloodstain Pattern Analysis theory and evidence as it relates to the scene investigation. The students will learn which elements comprise the best photographs possible and apply it to scene analysis, and then incorporate them into a Bloodstain Pattern Analysis report, knowing full well the findings could be discussed in court. The students will also create and construct demonstrative aids to assist in providing testimonial evidence before the court.

PREREQUISITE - Students must have completed a 40-hour Bloodstain Pattern Analysis class.

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN AND DO

- A renewed awareness of BSPA theories and terminology
- Correct photographic techniques
- Layout and design theory for a solid, court acceptable BSPA report
- Practical elementary bloodstain pattern experimentation/creation (demonstrative aids)
- Creation of a demonstrative model of a spatter pattern to illustrate and explain 2D & 3D aspects of BSPA
- Opportunities to speak publicly on BSPA theory before a group who know the theory
- Moot Court exercise

Police/Constable (ret.) Craig Moore retired in 2015 after 30 years of service. He has 16 years of experience with the Niagara Regional Police Service's Forensic Services Unit, numerous published articles, and has presented over 150 lectures. He has testified and been accepted as an expert in Bloodstain Pattern Analysis at the General Division and Superior Court of Justice jurisdictional levels in Ontario, the County Court level in New York State, and he was also called before a Board of Inquiry, with the Canadian Armed Forces, to offer expert opinion on a bloodstain related shooting case. He is an IAI certified Bloodstain Pattern Examiner. In 2006, the IAI recognized his efforts and awarded him the Distinguished Member title. Craig holds a B.Sc. In Criminal Justice from Hilbert College in New York.
